OGD: A LIFE OF SERVICE

IN THE BEGINNING: GATEWAY FRONT FOUNDATION

Before 1999, I had always been in a position to help people: the sick, scholarship for the needy, empowerment schemes, micro-credit schemes etc. at a stage, we then felt it was better to formalize it properly. Not only that, rather than set up what we could call Otunba Gbenga Daniel Foundation, I then decided that if we gave it a name that would be universal and acceptable especially to the Ogun State indigenes, we could easily get them to buy into it. So rather than personalize it, we make it a group effort. That is how we formed the GFF; basically to improve and enlarge the content of what we had been doing to help the masses and also to give everybody opportunity to buy into it. I feel quite happy and excited that it has been successful all the way”.

No doubt Otunba Gbenga Daniel used his vast experience in the private sector to a great advantage in his unique and result oriented state craft which transformed the entire landscape of the Gateway State and won commendations and laurels from many quarters. LETTER TO OGUN EAST STAKEHOLDERS

Leaders and Elders of our Great Party, the All Progressive Congress (APC),
Our Royal Fathers,
Our esteemed Community Leaders
Men, Women and Youth of Ogun East Senatorial District

1. I have decided to write to you today as a patriot and responsible citizen, to discuss the state of our country and most importantly, the future of our ancestral homeland: Ijebu and Remo.

As you know, I was born of Remo and Ijebu parents. My father and mother walked the streets of Makun and Omu, just like yours did. They represent the spirit of enterprise, entrepreneurship and economic sagacity, notable for all true born Ijebus and imbibed same spirit in me as much as your parents.

It is with this spirit of dedication, service and commitment that I formally express my desire to represent Ogun East Senatorial District at the Senate of the Federal Republic of Nigeria come 2023.

2. The Journey so far

Since 1999, our nation has continued to enjoy an uninterrupted democratic process. This process has come with its own challenges and trying moments. But despite these challenges and uncertainty that follows, we always find a way out. But this is not because the government has not been working, rather, it is occasioned by those who have taken it upon themselves to wreck the unity of our country and deny citizens their safety all in the attempt to pursue a parochial agenda. The Covid 19 pandemic as well as the global recession have opened our reality to the urgent need for a new frontier in economic growth. The world as we

know it is changing, and it is important for our nation to change the dynamics of wealth creation. This requires fresh ideas from those who have the experience and practical knowledge of leadership and entrepreneurship. The national assembly was created as a springboard to fine-tune government ideas and policies infusing such with the aspiration and desires of the constituencies and districts. It is not one to act in isolation but rather be an advocate for the people at the federal level to ensure government goals are in tandem with citizens dreams. For this to be achieved, the people require a representative that understands their collective aspirations and knowledgeable enough to proffer a roadmap for collective prosperity. Such representation requires charisma, network and impeccable negotiations skills. Only an individual with these qualities can provide pragmatic change and influence policies that will be of benefit to the district.

4. Ogun East: Challenges and Prospects

To say Ogun East is the cradle of education in Nigeria will be putting it mildly. Not only do we have the highest concentration of tertiary institutions amongst every other district in the country, we have provided this country with the best of men and women who have served and strived for its survival in politics, business, education, entertainment and general well-being. From our late sage Obafemi Awolowo who lighted the torch for our independence; Tai Solarin, the educationist and human rights advocate; Dr Herbet Ogunde, the doyen of entertainment and theatre; Pa Abraham Adesanya, a stallion who fought for the restoration of the June 12 election and collective interest of Yoruba race; His Excellency Dipo Diya, Chief Bisi Onabanjo, the Sofolas and many others too numerous to mention. At every mention, you will agree with me that our district has been blessed with the best of intellectuals. However, despite the continuous patriotic efforts from generations to generations, the Ijebu clan has been unable to benefit adequately from successive democratic administrations at the federal level. This is because we have not been able to put forward, a representative that possesses the tenacity and respect to adequately negotiate on our behalf. For us in Ijebuland, despite our contributions and commitment to the country, we have little or no federal presence to show for it. Everything we have today has been by the spirited efforts of stakeholders, state government and corporate partners. Up until recent approval, Ijebuland could not boast of any federal tertiary institution. Till date, we neither have any federal hospitals nor institutions as applicable to most districts across the country. The reason for this is not far fetched, we have not been lucky enough to have representatives at the national level who are passionate about the interest and general wellbeing of our people. This requires an immediate change.

5. My Political Journey

My sojourn into politics was influenced by Pa Obafemi Awolowo. As an undergraduate student at the University of Lagos, I was intrigued by the charisma of Awolowo and his passion for a more prosperous Nigeria. So I joined the Unity Party of Nigeria (UPN) and because of my commitment and services, I was made the head of the student wing of the party. This new position drew me

close to Papa Awolowo and I became part of the integral circle of his political family. Maybe if I had stayed in politics and not redirected my focus on finishing school and pursuing a career in electro-mechanical engineering, I would have joined the leagues of elected public offices holders sooner, despite my young age. But this would also have robbed thousands of people my foundation was able to change their lives with the resources from my career. But in the middle of my sabbatical, the June 12 election was annulled and like every true-born Yoruba at that moment, it was a clarion call to rise and defend our democracy in whatever way required. The National Democratic Coalition (NADECO) was formed and while many chose the sectors that suit their capacity, those of us in the corporate world chose to be financiers. It is, therefore, a no brainer that I joined the Afenifere group and subsequently the Alliance for Democracy (AD) when democracy was restored in 1999.

6. My Intervention in Ogun State

My focus in politics as a member of the Alliance for Democracy was to ensure the ideals of the Awolowo legacy continues not just in theory but in practice amongst the six Southwestern states. While I joined force with Afenifere to ensure AD wins the region, I was unhappy with the model of governance adopted by the government of my dear Ogun state. I desired to see that a state with so much potential and human capacity metamorphosise from the predominate civil servant state to an industrial hub, harnessing its array of intellectuals to compete economically with Lagos. After presenting numerous unactioned proposals and initiatives to the government on how this economic revolution can be achieved, I took it upon myself to contest for the governorship seat of the state and put these proposals into action. In 2003, I contested for the position of the governor of our dear and won what arguably remains the most resounding electoral victory in the history of state elections in the country. Although, as much as I would have loved to have this victory under the flag of AD, internal party politics and favouritism made it difficult to get fairness in the primary process. I was at a crossroad of choosing between staying in a party that no longer follows the ideals of Pa Awolowo but remains the identity of the Afenifere, which I remain a committed member to, and the desire to fix the prevailing problem of governance in my dear state. I chose the latter. It is therefore right to say that PDP was a child of necessity, driven purely by the love for my state and the overall desire to reroute the path of Ogun state to a more prosperous destination. Irrespective of the vehicle that brought me to the office, the eight years of my administration turned around the affairs of the state and laid down the industrial corridor that has continued to entice many multinational corporations to date. I dare say, that there is hardly any spheres of human lives that we did not stamp an indelible footprint of progress and development. In sports development, we created infrastructure and actioned initiatives that encouraged the youth to discover their talents right from secondary school up to the tertiary level. The Gateway Tertiary Institution Games (GATIG) discovered numerous talents and created an atmosphere for competitiveness across our tertiary institutions. At every district, we constructed world standard stadiums that serve as a nursing field for our energetic young generation to showcase their talents. This feat saw, for the first time in the history of the state, the hosting of the junior under 17 world cup in Ijebu -Ode.

PROFILE OF OTUNBA GBEGA DANIEL

P ROFILE OF OTUNBA (ENGR.) GBENGA DANIEL, FNSE, FAEng

Otunba Justus Olugbenga Daniel is an accomplished Engineer, a consummate politician, a quintessential Manager and philanthropist. A Fellow of the Nigerian Society of Engineers, the Institute of Directors, Nigeria and the Academy of Engineering, OGD, as he is popularly called in political circles was governor of Ogun State between 2003 and 2011; the Founder/Chairman, Kresta Laurel Limited, Lagos, an engineering firm specialising in elevators, power systems, overhead travelling cranes and hoists which has remained a leader in its area of competence.

Born on 6th April, 1956 into the family of the Most Reverend Adebola Daniel of Makun, Sagamu and late Madam Olaitan Daniel of Omu-Ijebu, Otunba Daniel, brilliant, audacious and intuitive as a college boy, attended Baptist Boys High School, Abeokuta, the School of Basic Studies at The Polytechnic, Ibadan and later studied Engineering at the University of Lagos. Daniel proceeded to earn a Master's in Business Administration (MBA) from the University of Lagos and subsequently attended the Lagos Business School for an executive programme.

A distinguished Fellow of the Nigerian Society of Engineers, Otunba Daniel cut his professional teeth with Metal Construction (West Africa) Limited. He later worked with H. F. Schroeder (West Africa) Limited, Lagos where he served as the General Manager and later, Deputy Managing Director making him the first African to rise to that position in the history of the company's operations. In 1990, he harnessed his extensive skills in vertical transportation, power generation and structural engineering in search of greater challenges and a wider field to plough and so, he established his own company, Kresta Laurel Limited which in a few years of its existence had become a household name, blazing the trail in a world dominated by foreign corporate giants.

Kresta Laurel Limited is the foremost and the only ISO 9001 certified lift company in Nigeria. It is also the authorised distributor of KONE; the number one elevator makers

in the world. Otunba Daniel's resolve to plough back into the society inspired him to go into public through a non-profit organisation, the Gateway Front Foundation (GFF) which has, over the years impacted positively on the lives of many through humanitarian and charitable activities.

To further affect the lives of the people positively, Otunba Gbenga Daniel in 2001 announced his candidacy for governor of Ogun State in the 2003 election, seeking the nomination of the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP). His foray into politics drew extensive media coverage with unprecedented level of popular support as he was regarded as a symbol of populist ideal to the common people. He launched a trail-brazing campaign declaring the official slogan, "A Contract with the People" with a commitment to improving the living conditions of many by awakening the sleeping giant which Ogun State then was through harnessing its human and natural resources.

He won both the 2003 and 2007 general elections and subsequently lived up to expectations of the people by bringing positive innovation and productive dynamism into governance. In terms of people-oriented programmes, it is widely acknowledged that Otunba Daniel restored hope, rehabilitated infrastructure, re-engineered institutions and firmly put in place an agenda of modernisation in Ogun State. With the core objectives to prepare, produce and support young leaders to improving their opportunities and competitiveness to impact on the society significantly, he established the Political Leadership Academy (POLA) with the vision to identify, codify, enhance and propagate principles and capacities needed for effective value-based socio-political and economic leadership by offering high quality, accelerated socio-political and economic education.

In 2018, he offered himself for the exalted post of the National Chairmanship of the nation's main opposition political party, the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP). He also spearheaded the Atiku Presidential Campaign Organisation which secured the candidacy of the former Vice President as the PDP presidential flag bearer in the 2019 general election.






1 . That we restored CREDIBILITY to governance in such a way that our people now know that government can be believed.
